

Voter Information

Who Can Vote: Anyone who is

- 1. A citizen of the United States
- 2. At least 18 years of age
- 3. A resident of the North Babylon school district for a period of 30 days preceding the vote.

Who Is Registered: All persons who were registered for and who voted in any North Babylon school or library election held at any time within four years prior to April 2, 2013 are eligible to vote in this election.

Note: Any District resident who is qualified to vote in general elections and who remains qualified to vote from the residence address from which he registered and who has voted in a general election within the last four years is qualified to vote in this library election.

Register in person at the NBSD Central Administration Office 5 Jardine Place, North Babylon between 9 AM and 3 PM or through the Board of Elections. BOE applications are available at the Reference Desk.

Regarding Absentee Ballots:

- 1. You must fill out an application in order to receive an absentee ballot.

A Message from Your Board of Trustees

If you want to discover just how busy the Library is, just take a look at the parking lot. More often than not you will find that it is filled to capacity, and beyond. Frequently we have patrons creating their own parking spaces! Upon entering the Library, many people ask, "what's going on here today?" or "what are you giving away today?" Well, the answer is there's a lot going on and exceptional service is being given away every day.

You may be one of our patrons using the Library to meet friends, participate in game day, attend a Tai Chi class, or watch a Friday afternoon movie. You might be borrowing a museum pass, participating in a special cooking class, concert, book discussion, craft or lecture held throughout the year - this would all explain the full parking lot. Don't forget all the Children's programs and services! Lest we forget, parking spaces are being taken up by patrons who use our computers, learn to use their e-readers (Kindle/Nook/iPad/Kobo, etc), do research, read a magazine or a newspaper or even borrow a book.

We are asking for your support of a 2% increase in our budget. We remain within the Governor's tax cap, a most formidable task. We recognize and share economic hardships. We would like you to consider supporting an increase of \$9.44 total, based on the average home assessed at \$3500.

During the heat waves of last summer and Hurricane Sandy, it was very clear that your Library is an essential service. For many patrons, we were the place to literally and figuratively recharge. The services that the Library provides are indispensable.

We have prepared for increases in health insurance and retirement. Both programs are coordinated by NYS. The retirement system has added a new tier for new hires with limited benefits. Both have been traditionally very well funded despite negative media coverage. We have prepared for a modest salary increase for the staff.

Registration continues to be held through the school district and the Board of Elections. Questions about the proposed budget will be addressed at the Public Information Meeting on Tuesday, March 19 at 6:30 PM. Our Library Director, Marc Horowitz, is available to sit down with patrons to review budgetary questions at any time.

The budget increase will cost a taxpayer with a home assessed at \$3,500 about 79 cents per month.

Your Board of Trustees believes that the Library is worthy of your support.

We think that our Library is the best bargain in town. If you agree, come down on April 2nd and demonstrate your support.




