Voter Information

Who can vote: Anyone who is:

1. A citizen of the United States
2. At least 18 years of age
3. A resident of the North Babylon school district for a period of 30 days preceding the election.

Who is registered: All persons who were registered for and who voted in any North Babylon school or library election within four years prior to April 8th, 2014 are eligible to vote in this election. Any district resident who is qualified to vote in general elections and who remains qualified to vote from the residence address from which he registered and who has voted in a general election within the last four years is qualified to vote in the library election.

From Your Board of Trustees

Libraries are about freedom - freedom to read, freedom of ideas and freedom of communication. Libraries are about education, about entertainment, about making safe spaces and about access to information. Books are only the tip of the iceberg. Our Library is a repository of information that gives every resident equal access.

Recent research shows that Americans overwhelmingly value the role of their public library in their community, and our local experience matches that research. We recognize that our Library plays an important role in giving everyone a chance to succeed, promotes literacy, improves the quality of life in North Babylon, and provides services that can not be found elsewhere.

Our Librarians and support staff are no longer the gate keepers of information; they are the guides to help patrons through the myriad of information. They help us separate the authoritative information from everything else.

Our proposed budget remains within the tax cap. Significant increases are health insurance and retirement and a small increase for our staff.

All measures of library use continue to increase. Door count, circulation, web site traffic, downloadable books and use of all other services have increased dramatically.

Registration will be held through the school district and the Board of Elections. Questions about the proposed budget will be addressed at the Public Information Meeting on Tuesday, March 18 at 6:30 PM. If approved, the budget increase will cost a taxpayer with a home assessed at \$3500 about 58 cents per month.

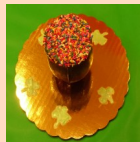

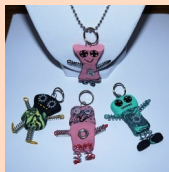

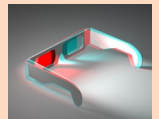
