

FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Fellow Community Members,

We have a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to purchase an adjacent piece of property and we would like your support in this venture. While other pieces of property have become available over the years and we have carefully evaluated each of them, the property at 210 Cooper Road is the most desirable option that we have reviewed. It is situated between the library's parking lot and a sump, making it very attractive to the library.

We have saved carefully for this opportunity!

Parking has been a worsening problem over the years. When the library was designed in the mid-60s, few residents had a second car and library usage was significantly different than today. The 44 parking spaces were more than adequate, but that has changed dramatically. The Board recognized long ago (as did all of our patrons), that we needed to expand parking, but the opportunities were few and far between. The current parking lot simply does not meet the requirements of the community; this speaks clearly to North Babylon's need for its library.

If approved this purchase will <u>not</u> require additional financial support!

The community's approval to purchase this property will *not* result in a tax increase! This is *not* a bond issue referendum. We are simply asking for your support in this process. We have been preparing for this opportunity for some time and have saved enough to make the purchase. It will take some time to save funds to work with the property. We continue to write grant applications to help with the library's major projects.

This is the right time.

We have updated our building over the years – furniture, bathrooms, roofing, solar panels, windows, HVAC, boiler, etc., to make our library functional in the 21st century. This is simply the next step.

This is the right thing to do.

We feel it is important to enlist the community's input and support in this venture. We strongly believe that this is a necessary purchase and we hope that you feel the same way. Be sure to cast your vote on August 30th.

Your Board of Trustees believes that this proposal is worthy of your support.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How much will this cost the average taxpayer?

Nothing! We recognized long ago that we did not have sufficient parking and began to save with property purchase in mind. No additional funds are being requested.

Parking is terrible! When will we fix this?

This has been an ongoing problem. It clearly attests to the high use of your library. What could demonstrate the importance of the public library better than a packed parking lot?

Why this property, why now?

Unlike previous opportunities, the property at 210 Cooper Road is the "right" property for the library. The property is situated adjacent to the library's parking lot. Other parcels have become available and have been considered, but this one is the best for the library and least disrupts the community. Due to the housing market, the appraised value of the property is less than it was just a few years ago.

What about the house?

Although it is early in the planning stages, we initially expect to use the house for storage, but we do recognize that its placement is inconsistent with full parking lot expansion. It is a beautiful structure and we will do our best maximize its use.

Are we getting a good deal?

The children of the original owner have agreed to make the property available at market appraisal (\$435,000). They have stated that they want the property to go to the library. This is fair to the owners and fair to the North Babylon community.

What are the costs to maintain the new property?

There will be costs to maintain the property such as landscaping; we do not anticipate personnel in the building, therefore utilities should be very low. We will need to heat the building sufficiently to prevent pipes from bursting.

What if the proposal is not approved?

We will be unable to expand the parking lot; parking difficulties will remain. While no building expansion is planned, without additional property, no expansion could ever be even considered, even 30 years from now. The house will go to a realtor for resale. It may not return to the market for generations, removing any future options in our lifetimes.

What is the timeline for this project?

We will conduct an election on August 30, 2016. If approved, we will close on the property at the convenience of the homeowners. Final preparation for paving will be made as funding becomes available.

Who can vote on this proposition?

Any registered North Babylon School District resident may vote.

Do I have to register to vote?

Yes. If you have voted in any public election in the past 4 years, you are registered to vote for the library's proposition. If not, you may register through the school district, 5 Jardine Place, North Babylon, 9 AM - 3 PM or the Board of Elections.

I won't be here on the date of the election. Are absentee ballots available?

Yes, absentee ballots will be available through the library's business office. It is a multiple step process (application and ballot); the ballot must be mailed or handed personally to the individual voter, so plan ahead.

Will there be a public hearing to discuss this proposition?

Yes. Prior to the August 16, 2016 Board meeting (6:00 PM), there will be a special meeting to review the proposition. The Board of Trustees and the Library Director will be in attendance for discussion.






