We're Back!

With the daily COVID increases in our district (2-3+/day), we are taking extraordinary measures to safeguard our patrons and staff. As of this writing, clean masks/face coverings are required to enter the building, gloves are optional, social distancing is essential. We are cleaning and disinfecting constantly. Returned library materials are subject to a 72 hour quarantine process. We are following the best practice guidelines from New York State, the CDC and the American Library Association.

Book stacks remain closed. Limited computer access is available. Library services and hours will expand over time, perhaps by the time you are reading this.

Our budget for 2020-2021 remains the same as last year. We could not ask for additional support under the pandemic crisis. The community was exceptionally supportive of our limited expansion plans; no one could have anticipated the pandemic ramifications. We will evaluate the expansion program over the next 6 months.
