



Ancestry.com - this database provides a tremendous amount of information for anyone researching their family tree. Family records (birth, death, marriage), public records (land, wills) and family tree charts.

Flipster - access to free magazines in an easy to read digital format. View the magazines on a computer or tablet with your library card.

Kanopy - access via streaming to over 30,000 feature films, documentaries, foreign language and educational videos.

Overdrive/Libby - access to thousands of e-books and audio books. Borrow them instantly using your computer or through an app on your mobile devices.

Pronunciator - access to the online database, Pronunciator. It offers self-paced lessons for sixty languages. Each lesson is comprised of flashcards that are read to viewers in the language that they are trying to learn.
