Voter Information

Who can vote: Anyone who is:
1. A citizen of the United States
2. At least 18 years of age
3. A resident of the North Babylon School District for a period of 30 days preceding the election.

Who is registered: All persons who were registered for and who voted in any North Babylon School District or Library election within four years prior to April 9, 2024 are eligible to vote in this election. Any district resident who is qualified to vote in general elections and who remains qualified to vote from the residence address from which s/he registered and who has voted in a general election within the last four years is qualified to vote in the library election.

Register in person at Central Administration North Babylon School District 5 Jardine Place North Babylon between 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM or through the Board of Elections. Board of Elections. Board of Elections applications are available at the Reference Desk.

Absentee Ballots:

1. Obtain an application in person at the Library or call and the Library will mail one to you.

2. Return the signed application.

3. The Library will send you an absentee ballot with SASE. The ballot must be mailed or handed personally to the individual voter.

4. Return the signed ballot by April 8, 2024.

From Your Board of Trustees

Your Board has assembled a budget which requests your approval of an increase of 2%. We remain within the NYS tax cap. With the exception of modest negotiated raises for the staff and health insurance premiums, the budget is basically flat. As tax payers, we appreciate the tax cap, but as service providers, we are challenged.

Our expansion is in full swing. As we have stated, there is *no bond issue* for this expansion and there is no request for additional funding. We will seek grants to assist us; we have done very well in the past. We hope to complete construction by the end of the year. Furnishings may come later.

Our library is extraordinarily careful with your money and our annual audits support that statement. We hope that every government entity follows our lead, but we read Newsday.

Locally, circulation of traditional library materials has remained consistent. County-wide, electronic checkouts have now exceeded print checkouts. Some readers still like the printed book. It's easy to use these new formats. If you need assistance, see our librarians. They will teach you everything you need to know.

We are now fully certified by the Sustainability Library Initiative: Environmentally Sound, Socially Equitable and Economically Feasible. We were the 4th library, nationally, to reach this goal.

We believe that the budget is worthy of your support.

If you agree with our plan, we urge you to come down on April 9th and demonstrate your commitment.



Winged Sumac seedlings. Winged sumac is a native, deciduous, large shrub that rarely exceeds 10 feet. The flowers appear in June, and the dull red to purple fruits are well-developed by September. The leaves turn bright red in the fall. Winged sumac (Rhus copallinum) looks similar to poison sumac, but doesn't cause an allergic reaction. North Babylon cardholders only.
